These two former Bryan college professors make understanding various worldviews easy, and give lots of examples you can use to explain the Christian worldview to others. It is also a great book on apologetics, answering some of the critical arguments raised against Christianity today.

Mind Siege, by *Tim LaHaye* and *David A. Noebel*. What influence has the secular humanist worldview had in America? What specific steps can Christians take to do something about it? This book has the answers.

Naming the Elephant, by *James Sire*. This is the best book available defining the concept of worldview and how one comes to embrace a particular worldview.

Philosophical Foundations for a Christian Worldview, by *J.P. Moreland and William Lane Craig*. This book outlines the essential elements of a Christian worldview. A resource for every Christian.

Thinking Like a Christian, by *David A. Noebel and Chuck Edwards*. This Bible study on the Christian worldview contains both a teacher manual and a student journal. The teacher manual leads the group facilitator step by step through teaching the Christian worldview and contains a CD-Rom complete with lesson plans. The student journal allows participants to record their thoughts and reflect on the Christian worldview during a daily devotional time. There is also a video with interviews from prominent Christian thinkers.

Understanding The Times, by *David A. Noebel*. This classic worldview analysis textbook provides the basics about the four worldviews most influential in western civilization, describing Marxism/Leninism, Secular Humanism, Biblical Christianity and the New Age movement in a highly readable format. Another addition to the "must have" reference library!

The Universe Next Door, by *James Sire*. This is the latest edition of a classic book which clearly explains the major worldviews at work in Western Civilization. A terrific resource to have in your library.
